Passing Christ's Peace

Reflection ScriptureColossians 1: 15-20a and Job 11: 5-9Rev. Derek KrehbielReflectionPastor Darlene

Today we reflected on how, when the world feels like it's unraveling—through political division, social distrust, and personal loss—we often reach for control as a survival instinct. But Scripture and the Trinity reveal a different way: not certainty or domination, but connection. The Triune God—Creator, Christ, and Spirit—is not a solitary ruler but a

relational community. Christ, as Colossians declares, is the center holding all things together—not by force, but through love that reconciles, heals, and binds.

Job's story embodies this invitation to relational trust amid suffering. When everything falls apart and explanations fail, Job doesn't retreat into false certainty or shallow answers—he leans into raw, honest relationship with God. And God responds—not with simple solutions, but with presence and perspective. In the same way, the Trinity shows us that the deepest transformation happens not through control but through mutual love, shared suffering, and enduring connection.

Yet history holds a painful irony: the Church, seeking to define the nature of God's being, was torn apart for over a century—sometimes violently—over a single Greek letter in the Trinity debate, "one iota's difference." But the very mystery that sparked division was meant to draw us into unity. Today, more than ever, we are called back to that original truth: that we are held together not by agreement, but by turning together to the God's co-creating, co-suffering, mutual love: of each other, our neighbors, and our enemies. In this divine pattern of self-giving relationship, we find a way forward—not by fixing the world, but by staying faithfully connected within it. Even in the unraveling, God is holding us—together.
